

# CRS: Background & Basics




#### **CRS** Background and Basics

- Created in 1990 (modeled after fire insurance rating)
- Authorized with NFIP Reform Act of 1994
- Voluntary program for NFIP communities
- CRS is a rating program (actuarial)
- A community CRS rating results in a direct insurance premium discount
- Of the 22,500 communities in the NFIP, 1,520 participate in the CRS
- This represents almost 75% of all NFIP policies









## Goals of the CRS

- 1. Reduce and avoid flood damage to insurable property
- 2. Strengthen and support the insurance aspects of the NFIP
- 3. Foster comprehensive floodplain management



CRS Class	CRS Credit/ Points	NFIP Policy Discount
1	4,500	45%
2	4,000	40%
3	3,500	35%
4	3,000	30%
5	2,500	25%
6	2,000	20%
7	1,500	15%
8	1,000	10%
9	500	5%
10	<500	0%

Objective: Improve flood insurance coverage in the community




- Community role in promoting insurance

- Supports the FEMA objective to "Close the Insurance Gap"






## National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS)









**CRS Class** 

#### Risk Rating 2.0: Equity in Action

- April 1, 2022, new rates become effective for ALL policies
- FMI Google "FEMA Risk Rating 2.0: Equity in Action"
- RR2.0 and CRS Communities
  - All policy holders will receive premium discount, not just those in the Special Flood Hazard Area
  - Growth of interest in CRS is likely to leverage more affordable flood insurance
    - New CRS communities
    - Class improvements for existing CRS communities


