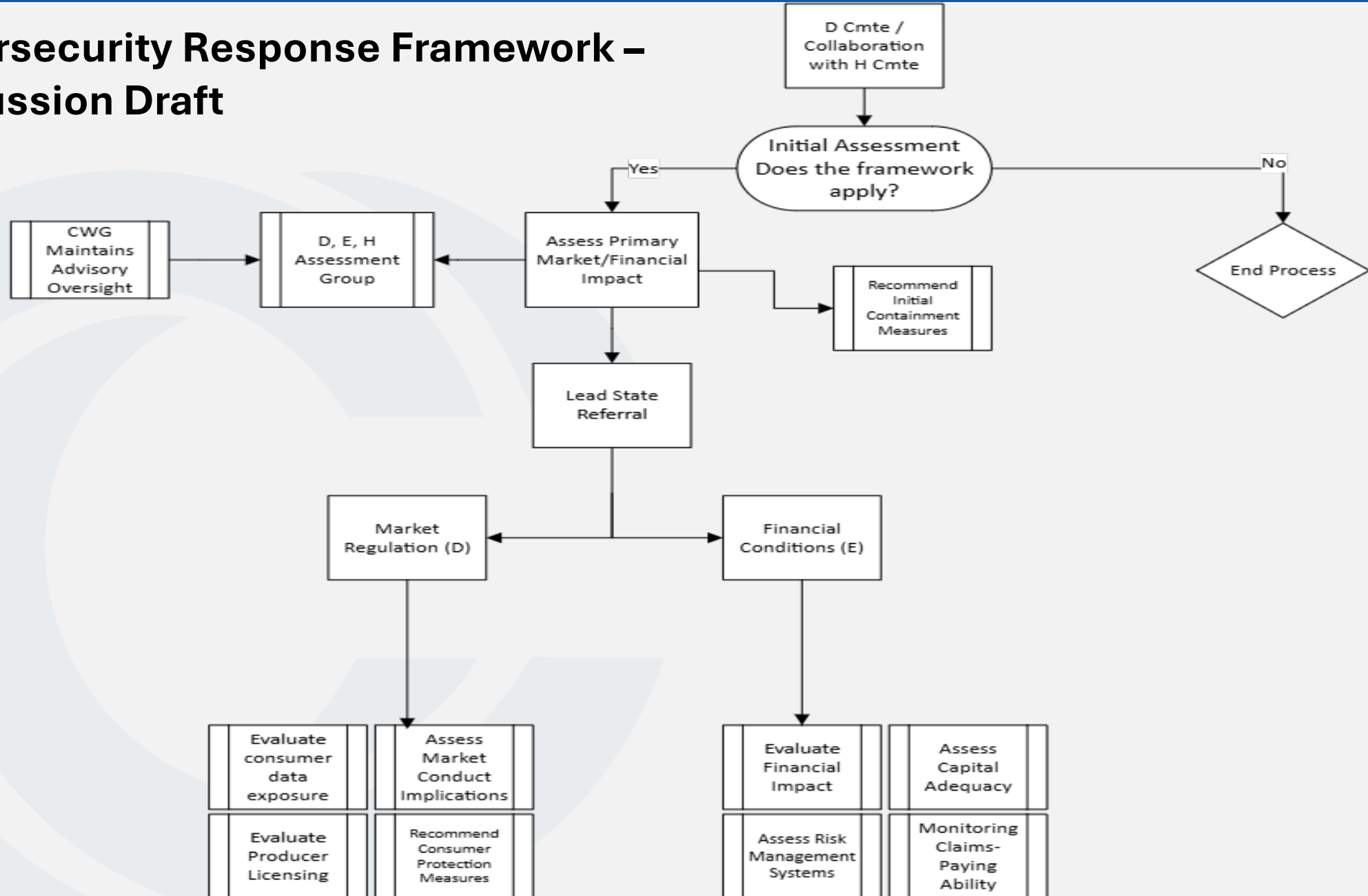

# Cybersecurity Incident Response Framework

- Purpose
  - Assist NAIC Members in assessing significance of cybersecurity events
  - Develop protocols for multistate coordination after a cybersecurity event
- Four Key Concepts
  - Develop criteria to assess impact of cybersecurity event
  - Develop threshold (dollar / consumer impact) that would trigger framework
  - Develop procedures to identify lead state for coordination of response
  - Clarify roles of Market Actions (D) Working Group, Cybersecurity (H) Working Group, Financial Analysis (E) Working Group

## Consumer Agent/Broker Service

- Concept arose from the Improper Marketing of Health Insurance (D) Working Group
  - One of the best ways to protect insurance consumers from fraud is by providing consumers the ability to verify an individual's licensing status prior to purchasing an insurance product
  - Complement the national system of uniform and reciprocal producer licensing
- Initial prototype created
  - Provides licensing status by line of authority.
  - Deference to states. Refers consumers to existing state links for additional information
- Threshold Question: Should role of NAIC include direct communication to consumers?

## Data Points for Consideration

- Licenses by line of authority by State
- Years of experience/licensure
- Company appointment and termination information
- Final administrative regulatory actions state insurance departments report to the NAIC's Regulatory Information Retrieval System. This could be limited to a flag or indicator reflecting whether an agent/broker has a serious regulatory action of concern.
- Confirmed closed complaints state insurance departments report to the NAIC's Complaint Database System. This could be limited to a flag or indicator reflecting whether an agent/broker has had a confirmed complaint involving a significant matter of misconduct.
